Illinois Budget Cuts

In his Budget Address, Governor Rauner called for "shared sacrifice" in addressing the budget shortfall. One sacrifice will be the elimination of all funds for respite care. This will impact any family that currently receives funding and support for respite care whether in-home or not. The governor requested a 10% across-the-board cut in the budgets of all agencies. Effects have already been seen in Human Services budgets and programs. The State has frozen already-awarded grants to Parks and Recreation Districts in Berwyn, Forest Park and Oak Park. It is unknown what effect this will have on people in nursing homes who are part of the Ligas Consent Decree and their ability to move into the community. Individuals on the PUNS list, even with critical or emergency needs, are not being funded at this time.

Developmental Disabilities Director Resigns

Director of the Division of Developmental Disabilities, Kevin Casey, has tendered his resignation and plans to take a position as Executive Director of the New Jersey Council on Developmental Disabilities. His last day with the agency was March 13th.

Greg Fenton will assume the role as Acting Director of the Division of Developmental Disabilities. Greg is currently the Deputy Director of state-operated developmental centers for the Division of Developmental Disabilities at the Illinois Department of Human Services. Kris Smith will be the Acting Director for the Division of Rehabilitation Services. Kris served most recently as Deputy Director of Vocational Services.

Federal Government Issues

Currently, efforts are moving forward to amend the Constitution to enact a balanced budget amendment (BBA). Such an amendment would force drastic cuts in Social Security, Medicaid, Medicare and other federal programs that people with disabilities rely on to live in the community. The Arc and other disability advocacy groups are strongly opposed to a BBA.


The Arc Convention

Seguin RCA Respite Weekends and Summer Camp

The first weekend respite camp was a success. Everyone, including the staff, had a good time. The group went to the Nicolas Conservatory, the Harley-Davidson Museum and the Ice Hogs Hockey Game. We took lots of pictures. Even the bone-chilling cold did not deter the fun.



The next respite weekend is planned for May 22-24 (Memorial Day weekend). The group will be going to BraveHeart for a full day program with horses. Many groups in the area use this organization including UCP-Seguin, Garden Center and Helping Hand, so we know they do a fine job of programming for people with disabilities. The cost for the weekend is \$200 which includes round-trip transportation, all activity fees and all meals.
